

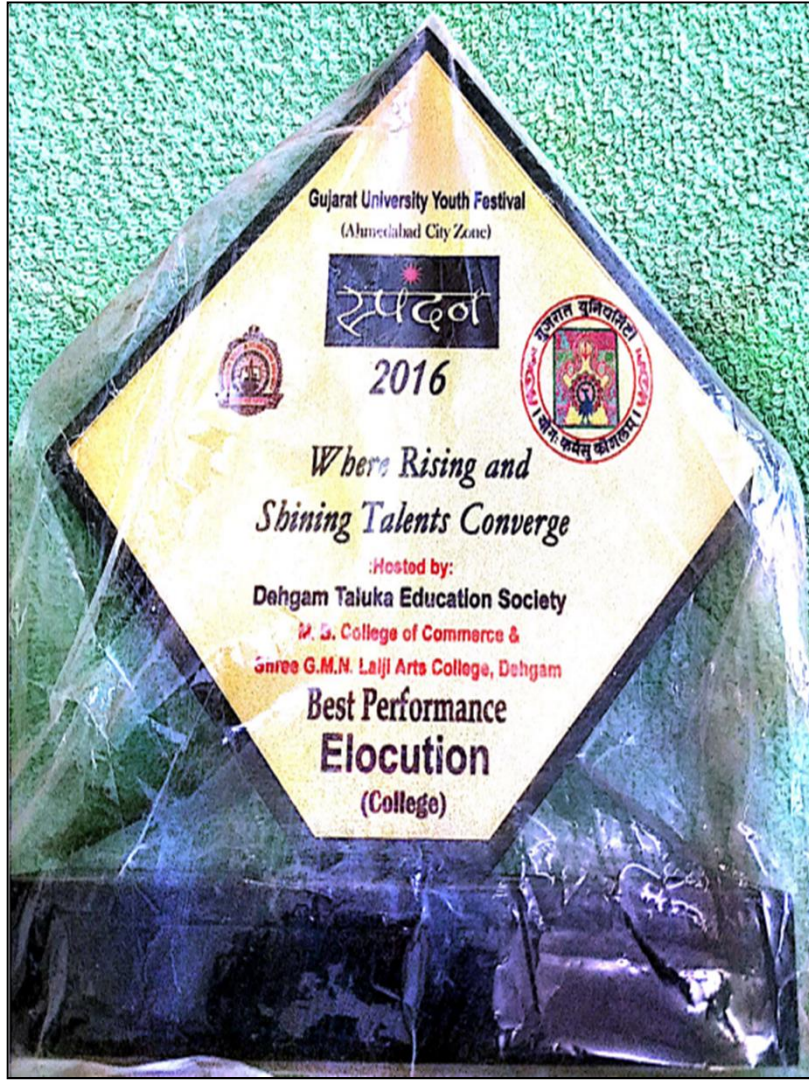

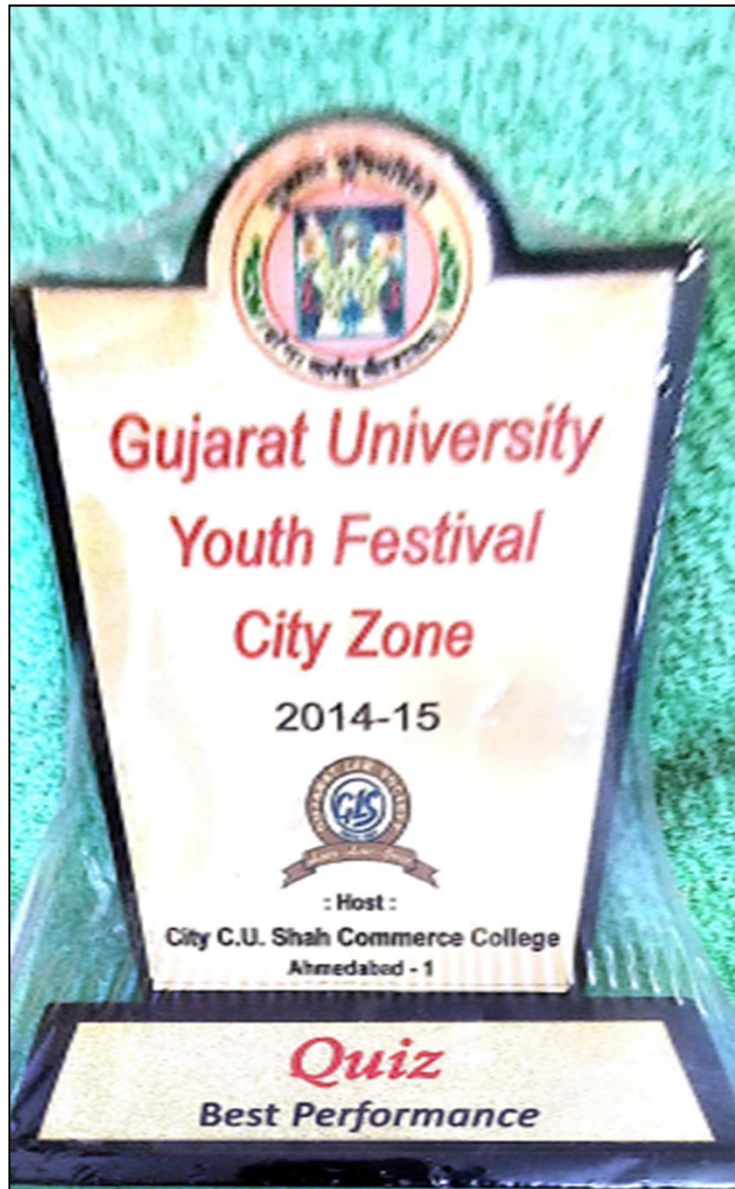

Gunning for glory

City girl Elavenil Valarivan finds herself among the shooting elite

Do you know that one of India's premier shooting championships, All India G.V. Mavliankar Shooting Championship, actually started in the city in 1960?

Though Ahmedabad's berth with shooting goes back to more than half-a-century, it is quite surprising that the city is yet to see a top class shooter in recent times.

While young Rushiraj Barot holds a promise for the future in pistol shooting, 18-year-old rifle shooter Elavenil Valarivan emerged as one of the stars to look for the future.

The first year Bachelor of Arts (English Literature) student of Bhavan's Arts and Commerce College is already a part of the Indian Junior team and has already picked a team bronze medal.

The game changer

However, for someone who started shooting just to try a hand at it, the biggest moment came when she was picked for the ambitious Project Leap— an initiative by London Olympics bronze medalist Gagan Narang to

Identify next generation shooters.

"I think that was the big game changer for me," the youngster told *Mirror* while talking about Narang's initiative. "Through the initiative, I was introduced into professional training. There are lot of things I didn't know of and became aware of," she explained, adding, "And as my results improved, my interest too increased."

From athletics to shooting

Talking about her initiation into the game, Elavenil said, "Actually, it has been these years that I started shooting." Understanding the astonishment, the youngster said, "I was into athletics. Then I was persuaded by friends to try out shooting."

"The Foundation (Gagan Narang Sports Promotion Foundation) had just launched its programme at our school (Sanskar Dham). It turned out I was good at it and got hooked," she

added.

"The more I started to take part in the tournaments, the more confident I became. And the more confident I got, I started to get better results," she said.

Among the elite

While she divided her time between Pune, Delhi (while training with personal coach Neha Chauhan) and Ahmedabad, Elavenil's consistent performance at national and international levels saw her move into the elite programme that aimed to nurture the brightest of young talent and monitor their progress on a yearly basis.

Talking about her stint with Slovakian Anton Balick, Elavenil said, "Among the several positives, I have been able to work on my swaying tendency in the camp. Identifying this minor issue and rectifying it has not only helped me to shoot confidently, it has also added consistency to my sport."

"As shooting needs both mental and physical improvements, the stint during the camp helped me work on both," she added.

Need better infrastructure

While Elavenil is gunning for glory, she just had one problem.

"There are many challenges for a shooter. We need good rifles and continuous supply of rounds for our training. But there is one thing that definitely requires immediate attention and it is infrastructure," she said, adding, "The Rifle Club is the best in the city, but it is nowhere near being world class."

Elavenil Valarivan Is Mentored By Gagan Narang

Ahmedabad: Elavenil Valarivan isn't a household name. But she may soon be one. The 18-year-old girl from Ahmedabad is making waves in shooting and is a regular member of the Indian Junior squad, representing the country at international competitions. She dreams to represent the country at the 2020 Olympics.

"I stood 28th in the World Junior Shooting Championship in Suhl (Germa-

ny) in the 10 metre air rifle category in June and also participated in another global meet 'the Meeting of Shooting Hopes' in Pizen (Czech Republic) held in May," said Elaavenil.

It wasn't really an eye-catching performance but a creditable achievement for the teenager, who took up

the sport at 13. "I took up the game at 13 courtesy Riya Shah, a national-level shooter in the 10 metre air rifle category those days. I used to keenly watch her practice at the Khokhara Sports Complex," states Elavenil.

The biggest moment of her career came when she joined the Sanskardham Global Mission International School, which runs the 'Gun For Glory Academy programme', a joint collaboration between Gagan Narang Sports Promotion Foundation and the Gujarat government to promote shooting in state.

Since then, Elavenil has gone from strength to strength.

This youngster has also been chosen under the Project Leap Vision 2024 - an initiative undertaken by Narang to identify next ge-

neration shooters to train them to be the best in the world.

Under the project, selected shooters will be mentored by top international coaches and will receive training at state-of-the-art facilities including sports science support for a full year.

"My next target is the Asian Air Gun Championship in Tokyo in November this year. But I hope to be a member of the Indian senior team by 2018 and aim to represent the country in 2020 Tokyo Olympics," said Elavenil.

Sport Authority of Gujarat director general Sandeep Pradhan also heaped praise on Elaavenil.

"She is an outstanding success story and I am happy that she has been picked by Gagan Narang," he said.





GU girls pick silver medal, boys settle for bronze

The Gujarat University (GU) girls' team of Deepshikha Saw, Ishwari Seth and Kosambi Sinha suffered a final heartbreak as they picked a silver medal in the tennis event of Khelo India University Games held in Bhubaneswar.

In the final, GU girls suffered a 1-2 loss against the girls from Hyderabad's Osmania University. Deepshikha gave the team a winning start as she recorded a 6-4, 7-6(3) win over Anusha



Deepshikha, Ishwari and Kosambi came second, while Aman, Bhruugen and Kamaksh took the third place

Kondaveeti. However, Ishwari could not keep the momentum going as she

suffered a 0-6, 6-7(7) loss against Sravya Shivani in the second singles.



In the decider, Ishwari and Deepshikha suffered a 4-6, 3-6 loss against

Sravya and Anusha to settle for the second-place finish.

Bronza for boys

Meanwhile, the boys' team of Aman Patel, Bhruugen Bondre and Kamaksh Dave settled for the third-place finish.

After a 0-2 loss against Punjab University in the semis, GU boys blanked Barkatullah University, Bhopal in the third-place play-offs.

Bhruugen gave GU the winning start with a closely fought 7-5, 5-7, 6-3 win over win over Akash Nandwal.

Skipper Aman then sealed the deal with a 6-2, 7-5 win over Udit Yadav.

Gujarat's **Deepshikha Saw** aced the All India Tennis Association (AITA) national ranking tournament by defeating Adrija Biswas in the final match held in Gurgaon from November 19 to 23.

Deepshikha edged past West Bengal's Adrija 7-6(7-1), 7-5 to be the crowned women's champion.

Receiving a bye in the first round, Deepshikha had a tough fight in the pre-quarters against Gauri Agarwal of Delhi. She lost the first set 3-6 but bounced back in the second set 7-5. In the tie-breaker, she recorded a 10-8 win.

In the quarter-final match, she edged past Rupkatha Mukherjee of West Bengal 3-6, 6-4, 6-2. Later in the semis, she recorded an easy 6-1, 6-1 win over Orissa's Anaam Almas.






